The College of Musical Arts at Bowling Green State University (OH) is seeking applicants for a tenure-track faculty position in composition at the rank of assistant professor starting August 2011. We seek a dynamic individual who can inspire students and work collaboratively with colleagues in other music disciplines. Qualified applicants must have a doctorate in composition by May 2012; demonstrated creative success in composition as evidenced by significant performances, presentations, recordings, publications, and participation in professional organizations; and successful teaching experience at the college level.

Responsibilities include teaching composition and all related courses on both the graduate and undergraduate levels; recruiting majors; and contributing to the artistic and intellectual environment of the college and the University. Additional duties may be assigned by the chair and/or dean. The salary is competitive and commensurate with peer institution levels for rank and position and in keeping with candidate's experience and credentials.

The College of Musical Arts offers the BM and MM in Composition and a DMA in Contemporary Music with specializations in composition and performance. It is the home of the MidAmerican Center for Contemporary Music, which hosts the Annual New Music Festival and Music at the Forefront.

Applicants should submit in PDF format as separate documents (1) a cover letter indicating interest in and qualifications for the position; include the names and contact information of 5 references and (2) a current curriculum vitae. At a later date, finalists for the position will be asked to submit three current (dated within one year) letters of reference; representative scores and recordings; relevant research and teaching materials; and an official transcript showing the highest degree earned.
