Places still available for 2006

The University of York hosts one of the UK's most respected and cutting edge music technology course. Places are still available for entry at Master's level in October 2006.

This is a taught degree programme, lasting 12 months. However, the course won't teach you how to operate a sequencer. Instead, you'll learn how to build your own software. The course won't instruct you on how to write music in a particular style - rather, you'll have the opportunity to use two Arup acoustics designed studios and the resources of the purpose built music research Center (<http://music.york.ac.uk/mrc>) to develop your own creative work. The music research centre at York maintains close links with many professionals from the recording industry, record labels and performance artists of international standing.

We welcome applications from people with either musical or engineering backgrounds, and also regularly admit professional practitioners without previous formal academic experience subject to a supporting folio of professional projects.
